Dear fellow parishioners, this weekend we celebrate Labor Day. In some countries it is celebrated on May 1, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. But America does the first Monday of September as the "end of summer." Many places

close up swimming pools, summer programs, etc. It used to be the last weekend before school started – at least when I was in school back in the Dark Ages or sometime just after the glaciers began to recede...

On Labor Day, government offices are closed to celebrate Labor... or maybe the freedom from it. It used to be one of the days I had as holiday when I worked in the real world... In any case, the Gospel works in favor with this "work" or "labor" theme this year. Jesus talks about work and intention. He corrected the Pharisees with this truth: "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." Now, there are rules and laws to be followed; we would have anarchy without them. But when they become more important than compassion, then there is a problem.

As we are beginning a new year - academically speaking - I urge you to think about what you have learned, or not, or need to, about the faith. When did you last try to educate yourself, or take advantage of learning about the faith? What are things that you don't remember being taught? Or even if they were taught... Sometimes this last statement was true. I can relate to lapses of education in my faith as well.

This can be fixed. There are several faith building things happening at our parishes. Bible Studies, RCIA, PSR (teachers and aides can still be used) all can give insight, new knowledge and even refreshing the knowledge we once had - again or not. There are also lots of online courses, readings, information at your finger tips. I use these sources myself - many are very good, some may be more questionable. If you have questions about them, feel free to ask me. Make an appointment and we can discuss questions. I am considering offering some sessions this coming year to enhance our educational program. Maybe on those things every Catholic should know. If there might be interest in this, let the office/s know.

I would like to close with this column with these thoughts from Jesus... to offer as thoughts for the week...

"Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."

Let us pray for each other - know that you are in mine always.
