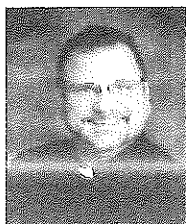

Dear fellow parishioners, we are in Ordinary Time with the next two weekends being the celebration of two great mysteries of our faith. This weekend - The Holy Trinity. It is probably the most challenging to try to "explain." It has been the basis for many heresies, as you have heard me say and write in previous years.

Recently, I was at a funeral (I know, surprise - but I was not the celebrant - I sang and played) and the priest was speaking on faith and he mentioned The Holy Trinity. He also said that this mystery was difficult to preach about. He mentioned it might end up being his shortest homily: "There is One God in Three Persons; co-eternal, co-omniscient, co-eternally present. Just believe it." While this seems so easy, it can be a challenge because we want to "know."

Sometimes, all we can do is believe and trust. We do demonstrate our belief in the Trinity as we make/pray the Sign of the Cross. The Sign begins and ends our prayers - giving indication to our belief in God being the beginning and the end of everything. You may want to consider beginning and ending your day with that prayer - to frame all that you do in the day with God's influence.

The Holy Trinity has been depicted in art in many ways. I was recently given a "Trinity Cross" as a gift. It shows Jesus on the cross enveloped by the Father (pictured as a bearded man) and Holy Spirit (pictured as a dove) just above Jesus' head. It is quite lovely and touching symbolism.

Another image that you may sometimes see is one of three interlocking rings. Each ring is the same size and depending on the rendition - they may resemble a Celtic knot that interlocks and interweaves. This is to inspire and "instruct" the observer to see how completely equal and integrated are the Three Persons. If you take away one, or make the person "less," you destroy the entirety of the "One." When I see this image, I like to trace the lines like one of those maze games - you know, find the way out or the way to the center. I used to like those as a kid - and still do along with word searches, word puzzles and even jigsaw puzzles. We used to do them a lot as kids and in the seminary.

Today - I invite you to consider the Trinity for a while. Give thanks to our God for being with us always and in all ways. Give thanks for the peace God brings - One God in Three Persons - who loves us unconditionally.

Let us pray for each other - know that you are in mine always.

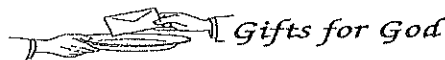
