Dear fellow parishioners, this week the priests of the diocese are moving to new assignments - stay off the streets on Tuesday! To the joy of some and sorrow of others, I will not be moving. Pray for the priests that are taking up new assignments. Especially, pray for the men that will be pastors for the first time. The Gospel for this weekend is good for this upcoming week: *Go on your way;*

*behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves...* I have to say that caution is sometimes not too far from the truth...

First time pastors, while they may have had some good priest mentors, will still have some challenges as they take the helm. Some will follow priests that have been the previous pastor for many years and were "beloved" to the point that their causes for sainthood have been started. They may run into the universal phrases: "Fr. *Previous pastor* didn't like it done that way." "We've never done it that way before and have *always* done it this other way..." "Fr. *Previous pastor* wouldn't let us do that." "Fr. *Previous pastor* \_\_\_\_\_ (fill in the blank)." A couple of times I finally had to actually say "Fr. *Previous pastor* is no longer the pastor... I am... and I want it done this way." Didn't go over too well... One time reminded a liturgy committee (I was the associate) that Fr. *Previous pastor* to whom they had been referring died over five years before and that the current pastor had approved what I was doing. Again - didn't go over well.

The above scenario is not always the case. Sometimes a new pastor follows one who might not have been "so beloved"... That transition has its own issues. The previous pastor may have even gotten into some type of problems or caused some harm to a parish community. It is common for folks to complain and try to draw the new priest into the trashing/bashing of his predecessor. That also is not healthy because it builds up further problems. When this happens, a healing has to happen for the community and it may take quite a bit of time.

One of the best pieces of advice given to me - and I wish it for all new and transitioning pastors. Again, it is from Jesus, Himself: "*Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you.*" This is why I always wish peace at the end of each column, and at the end of letters/memos/emails, etc.

Let us pray for each other - know that you are in mine always. Pray for our priests - we / they all need it!
